# YOUTH MINISTRY



So I was thinking...

about some of the myths that are so prevalent in our culture right now. Myths, such as, God does not exist, God is not good, God made me gay, there's nothing wrong with porn, and Christians and Muslims worship the same God. There are so many more out there. So, early in the month of November we (Rick and I and 11 students) attended a **reTHINK Apologetics Student Conference** in Eden Prairie, Minnesota, put on by the organization *Stand To Reason*. The entire conference was focused on these (and other) myths.

One of the goals of this year's conference was to equip students with understanding, identifying and guarding against false ideas. The very first night of the conference, Greg Koukl, Tim Barnett and Alan Shlemon presented truths, rooted in scripture, to explain that we are at war. A war that not everyone understands. A spiritual war of TRUTH encounters, not a war of power encounters. The chief weapon of the enemy, Satan, is lies and our chief weapon is truth. Which means in order to effectively fight in this war, we need to know accurate ideas about God and His world.

A few years ago I went through the Priscilla Shirer, *Armor of God*, Bible study. It quickly became one of the most important studies I have ever done and it is still my favorite. So I was thrilled to see them put Ephesians 6:11-18 (they did not have time to cover all the verses) into context for the students. The full armor of God is our battle plan! And being an apologist, informed and ready to stand against the lies, is the job of every Christian. The apostle Paul teaches us a few important things about being an apologist in 2 Timothy. First, in chapter 2, verses 24-26, Paul writes that we are not to be quarrelsome, but patient when wronged and gentle when correcting the opposition. He states that we are to act that way so that "they may come to their senses and escape from the snare of the devil, having been held captive by him to do his will." They are blinded by the lies and we are to be the antidote to their blindness with our kindness and grace. He also says in chapter 4, verse 2, "Preach the word; be prepared in season and out of season; correct, rebuke and encourage – with great patience and careful instruction." So again, speak up about the truth, but do it with great patience.

We no longer live in a time where we can protect our children from the false ideas that exist. Neither can we pretend they will go away. With computers in our pockets we cannot afford to ignore the fact that they will hear them, see them or seek them out. We also can't assume they will voice the false ideas they hear to us when they find them. Blaise Pascal, a mathematician, physicist and religious philosopher back in 1623 said, "Truth is so obscure in these times, and falsehood so established, that unless we love the Truth, we cannot know it." How much more does that seem to apply to today's culture? We need to make it a priority to teach our children about the false ideas enough so they understand it, the reasons people believe it, and what's wrong with those reasons. Then, equip them with truth, practice, resolve, and confidence to be leaders in their circle of influence. To stand up to for truth, to love Truth, and to tear down the false ideas and not the people holding them.


